Questions and Answers on "The Cock and the Jewel Necklace"

1. Who are the main characters of the story?
2. What did the chicken find?
3. What does the chicken say in the end?
4. What is the moral of the story?

Answers

1. The main characters of the story are a cock and a jewel necklace.
2. The cock (or rooster) found a necklace.
3. The bird says in the end that it would rather choose a single grain of rice instead of the expensive necklace.
4. The moral of the story is, *"Precious things are without value to those who cannot prize them."*
